

- II. If the Holy Spirit works beyond what is familiar to us how will we know if it is of God? Will it always be in ways consistent with scripture?
 - A. One of the most important reasons to know Scripture is to be able to <u>discern</u>.
 - B. Herod: "If it is <u>true</u> what can you tell me?"
 - C. Can we trust ongoing revelation?
 - D. God has the <u>capacity</u> to reveal from any source He chooses and God has more <u>resources</u> than we are familiar with.

- III. Is the price of giving Jesus His <u>rightful place</u> ever too high?
 - A. From a human perspective it can feel like yes.
 - B. Having <u>access</u> to the truth and even being perceived as the <u>caretakers</u> of Scriptures does not make you a <u>guardian</u> of the truth.
 - C. Never confuse the level of authority you walk in, with the level of authority you encounter.
 - D. Failing to count the cost of disobedience cost these Jewish leaders what they could have had.
