The story begins with Joshua sending two men of honor.... where they find an unlikely hero.



Matthew 1:5-6

"...and Salmon the father of Boaz by Rahab, and Boaz the father of Obed by Ruth, and Obed the father of Jesse, and Jesse the father of David the king."



- I. The spies went to the home of Rahab (<u>prostitute</u>).
 - A. <u>Strategic</u>: Not for reasons most would assume.
 - B. Perhaps God was finally answering her <u>prayer</u>.
 - C. Way too often identities are <u>assigned</u>.



- II. The king mistakenly assumed Rahab was loyal.
 - A. The King sent men to Rahab to <u>catch</u> the spies.
 - B. Why <u>choose</u> the spies over her people?
 - Destiny
 - Mistreatment
 - Honor

- III. Rahab confessed that God, their God, was her <u>hope</u>.
 - A. She cast her lot and her destiny with their God.
 - B. She took <u>tangible</u> steps to tie her destiny to theirs.



Then these men of honor returned to tell Joshua, "Truly the Lord has given all the land into our hand. And also, all the inhabitants of the land melt away."

Joshua 2:24 is a direct quote of Joshua 2:9 – the words of an unlikely hero – Rahab.
