We need to feel the gravity of what happened.

I. To understand the connection between the Passover Lamb and Jesus is essential.

A. The Passover Lamb was slaughtered for the protection and freedom of God's people.

B. When times get difficult it is tempting to look back longingly at what held us captive.

II. To be at table with Jesus doesn't always mean we are "WITH" Jesus.

A. Jesus declared one of you will betray me.

B. Instead of Jesus making them feel better He does the exact opposite.

C. You cannot betray what you have not partnered with.

III. To live in a climate is not equal to comprehending.

A. The disciples were present but had no idea.

B. And yet we have this bread and cup

C. TRUTH: Because of the power of Jesus that exists in this bread and this cup I do not have to be a casualty of my environment.

Jesus knew that they would one day soon understand what happened that night.
