- I. We do speak wisdom.
  - A. <u>Yet</u>...
    - 1. We know nothing but <u>Christ</u>, and him crucified, yet we still speak wisdom.
    - Our message is more about a <u>demonstration</u> of Spirit and power, yet we speak wisdom.
    - 3. There is a <u>futile</u> wisdom of the world, yet we speak a productive, Godly wisdom.

- I. We do speak wisdom.
  - A. <u>Yet</u>...
  - B. We speak this wisdom to others.
  - C. To the world this wisdom will often be <a href="hidden">hidden</a>.
  - D. The world often won't <u>understand</u> this wisdom.

- I. We do speak wisdom.
  - D. The world at times will call this wisdom <u>foolish</u>.
  - E. What the world calls foolish are actually the most <u>awesome</u> things of God

- II. Godly wisdom comes from the Holy Spirit.
  - A. Holy Spirit searches <u>everything</u>, even the <u>depths</u> of God.
  - B. Holy Spirit is only one who understands the <u>thoughts</u> of God.
  - C. Holy Spirit helps understand <u>gifts</u> God freely gives.

- III. Wonderful <u>results</u> from the wisdom the Holy Spirit gives
  - A. We speak wisdom not taught by humans but by the <u>Holy Spirit</u>.
  - B. We <u>interpret</u> spiritual truths to those who are spiritual.
  - C. We can <u>discern</u> if what we are hearing are words taught by men or by the Holy Spirit.
  - D. We have the mind of Christ.
