- There were many elements in this story unique to Jesus.
 - A. There is a cosmic feel to the story.
 - 1. God's will and the devil's meet in a tremendous <u>clash</u>.
 - 2. A critical scene in the <u>war</u> between God and Satan
 - 3. A cosmic showdown

- II. Some pieces of Jesus' temptation can be <u>applied</u> to ours.
 - A. The timing
 - 1. The very **beginning** of a new ministry
 - 2. Don't be surprised when you say yes if spiritual battle <u>escalates</u> quickly.
 - B. The <u>recipe</u> for resistance
 - 1. Scripture
 - 2. God is the only one in whom I put my TRUST

- II. Some pieces of Jesus' temptation can be <u>applied</u> to ours.
 - C. Restoration at the end
 - 1. Resist the devil and he shall flee.
 - 2. Angels came ministering.
 - 3. The time came when God said this battle is **finished**.
