


Beware : pay attention, be cautious

Practice : a patterned way of behaving

Righteousness: the spectrum of doing good works

Hypocrite : a false piety with the hope of being praised for it

- I. A 'good Pharisee' needs to be seen :
- A. Giving alms to the poor (not a tithe)
 - B. Praying in synagogues and on street corners
 - C. And Fasting

II. When we do such things in order to be seen, "...they cease to be 'righteousness'" (Lenski).

A. Do them to be seen OR trusting God sees.

B. The difference between looking for credit from people or for opportunity to join God
