

Jesus has authority:


- I. To speak hard <u>truths</u> to individuals Matthew 8:18-22
 - A. Jesus told a scribe, "You are <u>not</u> ready"?
 - B. To another, "You <u>can't</u> just work Me in."

Jesus has authority:

- II. To command the <u>natural</u> world Matthew 8:23-27
 - A. We don't know what the disciples expected Jesus to do, but they needed to know Jesus cared.
 - B. They cried out for Jesus to save them, but they didn't <u>define</u> what that salvation looked like.

Jesus has authority:

- III. To displace <u>demons</u> Matthew 8:28-34
 - A. Jesus and the demons knew Jesus had the authority to <u>evict</u> these demons.
 - B. The demons didn't ask if Jesus thought He was man enough to take them on.
 - C. When the herdsmen fled into the city they told what happened to the <u>demon-possessed</u> men.
 - D. They <u>begged</u> Jesus to leave their region.



- My Father God, My Savior Jesus Christ, My Holy Spirit, has <u>unmatched</u> authority.
- It <u>matters</u> if you have God-given authority but refuse to exercise it.
- Where God has given you authority,
 He has given you <u>responsibility</u>.
