40 days: the time between resurrection and ascension

Jesus was actively <u>discipling</u> His disciples.

- I. Jesus educated them.
 - A. Jesus <u>reminded</u> them of what He had already taught them.
 - B. Jesus opened their <u>minds</u> to understand the prophesies.
 - C. They asked questions that made sense to <u>them</u>.

- II. Jesus <u>commissioned</u> them.
 - A. Matthew 28:18-20, Luke 24:48, and Acts 1:8
 - B. Commissioned but not yet <u>released</u>
 - C. Wait until you receive the power of God.
 - D. Their first order was to wait.

- III. Jesus prepared them.
 - A. While you wait, wait together.
 - B. Have you <u>received</u> the power of God?
 - C. The purpose remains: <u>BE</u> witnesses for Jesus.

- IV. Jesus <u>left</u> them.
 - A. <u>Unresolved</u>: that's what happened here.
 - B. These men dressed in white robes knew why.

We grieve Holy Spirit when we:

- 1. Quit <u>expecting</u> Him to move.
- 2. Focus on times/seasons and take our eyes <u>off</u> of Jesus.
- 3. Close ourselves off to the possibility that there is <u>more</u>.
- 4. Turn down OUR commission.

Saying yes to God is a lot easier when we practice, and learn to <u>trust</u>, what is unresolved!
