 - A. Integrity Isaiah 1:11-14.
 - B. Intimacy Isaiah 1:15.
 - C. Faithfulness Isaiah 1:16-17.

- III. Restoration comes after decay or destruction.
 - A. We celebrate the <u>joy</u> of restoration without taking into account the nature of the <u>decay</u>.
 - B. Restoration comes in the <u>Messiah</u>, Jesus Christ.
 - C. The greatest problem is not the <u>need</u> for restoration, the greatest problem is rejecting the <u>gift</u> of restoration.
