A. Integrity Isaiah 1:11-14.

B. Intimacy Isaiah 1:15.

C. Faithfulness Isaiah 1:16-17.

III. Restoration comes after decay or destruction.

A. We celebrate the joy of restoration without taking into account the nature of the decay.

B. Restoration comes in the Messiah, Jesus Christ.

C. The greatest problem is not the need for restoration, the greatest problem is rejecting the gift of restoration.
