## Prophecy: God let Isaiah see what was in the <u>future</u>.

An oversimplified summary (2:22-3:1) . A. Stop worrying about what people think instead of what you know is the heart of God. This "fear of <u>man</u>" is misplaced fear. B. Stop regarding man and disregarding God.

II. A more intense review A. Isaiah 3 - What was prophesied happened. B. Isaiah 4 - Disobedience comes with a price. C. Isaiah 5 - God's intent and the result of disobedience

III. The heart of all trauma, trouble, evil, and injustice - "<u>Woe</u> to those who call evil good and good evil." A. The ploy of Satan has been to <u>confuse</u> us. Do you remember the <u>garden</u>? B. Then we begin to believe the <u>lies</u> that tell us evil is really good and good is really evil.

III. The heart of all trauma, trouble, evil, and injustice - "Woe to those who call evil good and good evil." C. When we as Christ followers treat the favor we have been shown by God as a personal <u>reward</u> instead of as a personal <u>responsibility</u> then we have become part of the machine of injustice. Injustice cannot stand before God.

At the heart of God is justice.

Injustice is an offense to the heart of God.
