

III. Question: “Why couldn’t we cast this demon out?”

C. It is hard to see the needle move toward belief if we refuse to consider that we just might need more tools.

The problem might not be belief. The problem might be:

- The tools we are familiar with
- Gaining access to tools we need but don't currently have
- The willingness to tap into the resources God has placed in someone else's tool shed
- Or even an unwillingness to embrace the words of Jesus in the Garden
