BELIEVE HELPMY UNBELIEF

- I. This man was <u>honest</u> with Jesus and Jesus was <u>honest</u> with him.
 - A. <u>I</u> Believe. Help <u>MY</u> unbelief.
 - B. "ALL things are possible for those who believe."
 - C. Jesus does not say all things are guaranteed.
 - D. It is still true: With <u>GOD</u> all things are possible.

- II. The outcome was not what it <u>first</u> appeared to be.
 - A. They thought the boy was <u>dead</u>.
 - B. Jesus took him by the hand and <u>lifted</u> him up.
 - C. Think of a time when Jesus touched your life.

- III. Question: "Why couldn't <u>we</u> cast this demon out?"
 - A. Both question and answer were <u>specific</u> to this situation.
 - B. The question becomes: How hard will we work to acquire the necessary tools when the ones we have don't work HERE?



C. It is hard to see the needle move toward belief if we <u>refuse</u> to consider that we just might need <u>more</u> tools.

The problem might not be belief. The problem might be:

- The tools we are <u>familiar</u> with
- Gaining <u>access</u> to tools we need but don't currently have
- The <u>willingness</u> to tap into the resources
 God has placed in someone else's tool shed
- Or even an <u>unwillingness</u> to embrace the words of Jesus in the Garden
