C. And when we are the teachers, it's our responsibility to make sure that we are sharing is true.

- III. You cannot make the gospel conditional.
- A. Making hope conditional implies that you can earn your way into Heaven, which is not true.
 - B. Grace is the free gift of God!
 - C. ONLY faith in Jesus can save us!
