Grace: A Gift Given with delight or <u>favor</u>, a gift of life that is more powerful than <u>death</u>, and all we have to do is <u>receive</u> it.

Paul's defense of God's grace makes me <u>GLAD</u>:

- I. As a Gentile:
 - A. Glad Holy Spirit was <u>clear</u> in the message.
 - B. Glad Paul stood his ground while under <u>attack</u>.
 - C. Glad that Titus was not forced to follow ritualistic <u>legalism</u>.

- II. As a Believer:
 - A. Glad false brothers and sisters are exposed.
 - B. Glad for the <u>courage</u> of those who stood their ground against the attempts of spiritual <u>slavery</u>.

III. As a Leader:

- A. Glad for Holy Spirit <u>revelation</u> that stays true to Scripture.
- B. Glad that those with <u>influence</u> saw God's grace in Paul and Barnabas.
- C. Glad for the right hand of fellowship:

 Not because of <u>position</u> but <u>credibility</u>.

III. As a <u>Leader</u>:

- D. Glad the message is simple: Preach <u>Jesus</u>.
- E. Glad that God shows no <u>partiality</u>.
- F. Glad that I can <u>affirm</u> those sent elsewhere while I <u>live</u> into my call.

If you are concerned that we are too focused on grace and not saying enough about <u>obedience</u> remember this is about salvation.
