

- I. Freedom <u>does</u> <u>not</u> look like circumcision.
  - A. If you accept ...
  - B. <u>Faith</u> in the Law accepts what comes with it.
  - C. To accept this means you are then severed from Christ.

- II. Freedom has Re-defined boundaries.
  - A. Freedom redefines, not <u>erases</u> boundaries.
  - B. What are the <u>right</u> boundaries where I can <u>KNOW</u> true freedom?

- III. Freedom is living into the other side of the filter without going back or looking back.
  - A. Do not use freedom as an opportunity for the <u>flesh</u>.
  - B. Freedom <u>dwells</u> in the shelter of God and <u>lingers</u> His shadow.
  - C. We cannot *live* under the cloud of a <u>religious</u> spirit.

- IV. Freedom looks like <u>fruit</u> that looks like <u>Jesus</u>.
  - A. Freedom begins by knowing who your <a href="Father">Father</a> is.
  - B. Freedom means <u>love</u> your neighbor as yourself.

There is no freedom outside of the boundaries of Jesus but <u>fullness</u> of life within.
