## II. Riddles A. Grace and truth are <u>inseparable</u> with Jesus. B. Her response was true but <u>dishonest</u>. C. Jesus didn't <u>let up</u>.

## III. Revelation

- A. Jesus revealed <u>Himself</u> to her.
- B. Jesus revealed <u>He</u> <u>SAW</u> HER.
- C. If you are ready to receive that Living Water the Spirit of God is ready to come bubbling up <u>inside</u> you, <u>wash</u> you clean and <u>transform</u> you.
- D. Many of the Samaritans who heard the woman's testimony <u>encountered</u> Jesus for themselves, and they too believed.

The invitation is to experience a <u>deeper</u> encounter with Jesus Christ than ever before.
