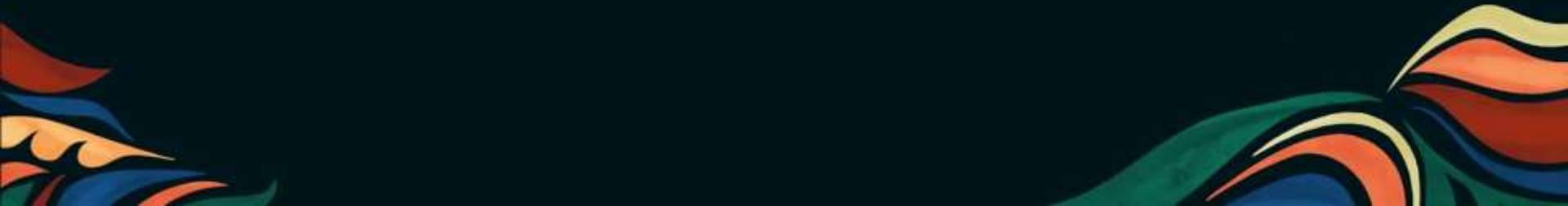

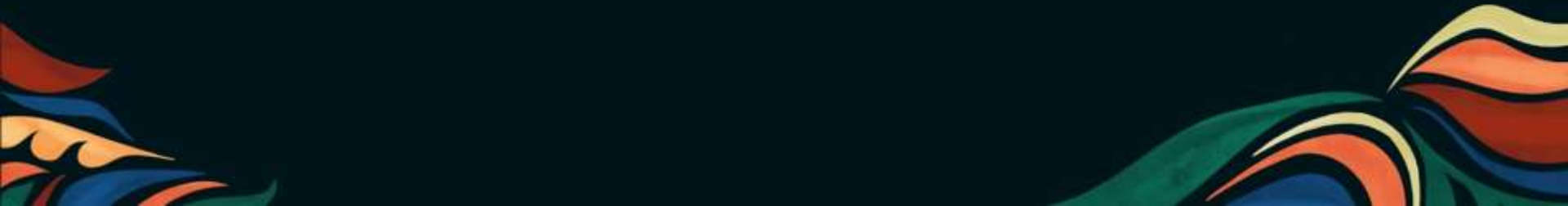

 - C. Jesus told them not to work for food that spoils but to work for food that endures to eternal life.



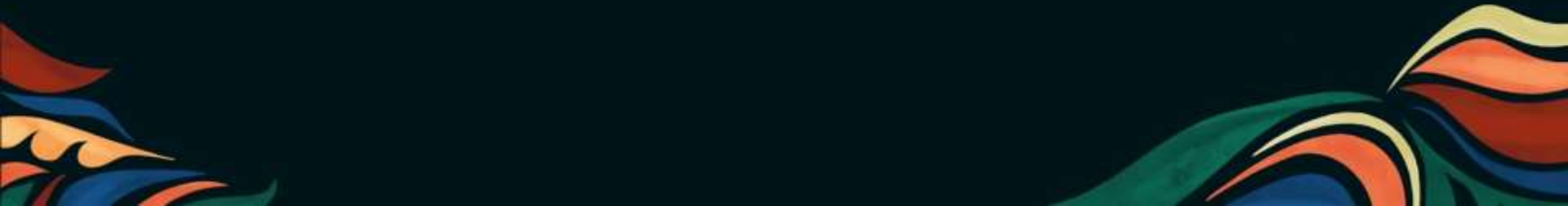
- II. They were blind and could not see the signs Jesus had already given.

A. “Sir (continually) give us this bread.”

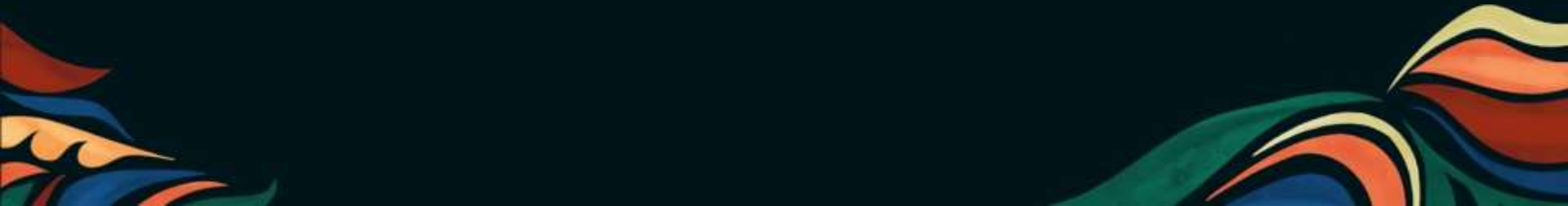
B. You do not hunger for God because you are satisfied with what you already have.
