Jesus asked: "Do you take <u>offense</u>..." at what I am teaching?

Jesus was teaching the necessity of <u>believing</u> and <u>knowing</u> that Jesus has the words of eternal life.

I. Jesus had earned the right to be <u>heard</u>.

- A. Jesus preached the <u>Sermon</u> on the Mount.
- B. Jesus did many <u>miracles</u> in Capernaum.
- C. Now Jesus was back in Capernaum <u>teaching</u>.

II. When Jesus' teaching got <u>hard</u> many of Jesus' disciples grumbled and were <u>offended</u>.

A. Many disciples found His teaching <u>hard</u>.

B. <u>Not</u> much has changed.

C. Yet the message of Jesus is really <u>GOOD</u> News.



III. Those closest to Jesus had <u>nowhere</u> else to go.

A. Jesus' teaching was hard and <u>relentless</u>.

B. Jesus asked the 12 if they also wanted to <u>leave</u>.

Lord: "He to whom a person <u>belongs</u>." Thayers C. Believing and knowing Jesus as Lord is the <u>key</u>.
